NCM's 28TH YEAR... & PLANT TOURS RESUME

As I write this month's column, I'm just back from a very enjoyable Labor Day trip to Bowling Green, KY where I joined a most congenial crowd of about 500 fellow Corvette Museum fans to celebrate NCM's 28th year. Among many outstanding moments was the **Stingray Walk-Around**, where Z06 and 70th Anniversary coupes and convertibles were parked with a team of Corvette engineers available to answer all our questions. Invited to hop in a favorite Stingray and dream, I picked a torch red 70th Anniversary convertible... what a dream!

ASSEMBLY PLANT UPDATE: I'm pleased to share this most awaited Assembly Plant announcement. Kai Spande, Assembly Plant Manager, began his presentation saying the popular assembly plant public tours will resume in mid-November 2022...and of course he got a rousing ovation from the audience!

Using a plant floor schematic, Kai showed the tour route for viewing various operations. He discussed each area in detail, citing some changes, and highlighting a new viewing experience where Corvette colors are applied to painted parts. To minimize chances of accidental damage while on the line, painted parts are now assembled on the Corvette near the end of the assembly process. Though without access to the actual painting operation, viewers will watch robot applicators in action.

Discussing the intricately designed Stingray assembly, Kai pointed out that production isn't based on when orders are received from dealers. Rather, the line is arranged to intersperse specific models — like Z06s and export Corvettes with right-hand drive — with domestic-market base coupes and convertibles. This carefully planned assembly sequencing yields production efficiency.

Kai said the NCM and Assembly Plant will honor the thousands of IOUs for those R8C (Museum Delivery) customers who had to postpone their tours due to COVID and the December 2021 tornado that damaged the plant. Tours are not scheduled by the plant but will continue to be scheduled by NCM for all customers.

Sharon Brawner, NCM President/CEO, said Museum members will be given priority in the tours for a week or two prior to the opening of public tours. When public tours begin, scheduling will be on a first-come basis.

CORVETTE TEAM UPDATE: Harlan Charles, Corvette Product Marketing Manager, recapped all the great news surrounding Corvette, noting according to sales Corvette owns 50% of the sportscar market. He covered what's new for the '23 model year.
