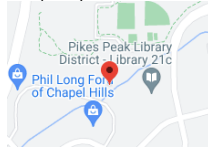

National Council Of Corvette Clubs Bans Corvette E-Ray, EVs And Hybrids From Events

The recently unveiled 2024 C8 Corvette E-Ray marks a change in the trajectory of everything a Corvette has traditionally been, thanks to the introduction of an all-new hybrid powertrain. Unfortunately, it's the same hybrid drivetrain that drove the National Council of Corvette Clubs (NCCC) to ban the C8 E-Ray, along with other hybrids and EVs, from participating at track days.

According to a report from *Corvette Forum*, the reasoning behind this ban may not be what you originally thought. The NCCC isn't acting on implicit bias towards the electrified Vette, but rather towards concerns of the inability of emergency officials to handle electric fires in the event of an accident. Damaged battery cells can experience what's called thermal runaway, where the internal temperature of the battery rises out of control. In fact, the NCCC has gone so far as to ban EVs and hybrids, including the Corvette E-Ray, from being within 30 feet of any structures or other vehicles at events.

Forward-thinking readers may be wondering if this ban would affect the upcoming C8 Corvette Zora. Well, dear reader, you would be correct, as the hybrid drivetrain in the C8 Zora would render it ineligible to participate as per the NCCC's current rulebook. This also means that any future electrified Vette – fully electric or otherwise – is effectually pre-banned from competition. However, the forthcoming C8 Corvette ZR1 would be good to go, as it will feature an ICE-only powertrain.

As a reminder, the 2024 Corvette E-Ray combines the naturally aspirated 6.2L V8 LT2 gasoline engine, rated at 495 horsepower and 470 pound-feet of torque, while an electric motor, rated at 160 horsepower and 125 pound-feet, on the front axle, bringing total output up to 655 horsepower. A new variant of the C8's dual-clutch, eight speed automatic transmission (RPO code MLH) is exclusively offered with the E-Ray.

Under the color-matched body panels, the C8 E-Ray rides on the GM Y2 platform, which it shares with all C8 variants. The hybrid Vette will go on sale in late 2023, and will be built alongside the C8 Stingray and C8 Z06 models at the GM Bowling Green plant in Kentucky.

Get to Know Your Fellow Members

An Interview with Ted & Dusty Severn

How long have you been a CSCC member? **Since August of 2016.**

What Corvette(s) do you currently own? **A 2012 Crimson Red Grand Sport. Previously owned a 1965, 327. Bought in 1967 and taken to Germany while stationed there. After owning the '65 for a year and a half he sold it to a lieutenant when he and Dusty started having kids.**

Marital Status? **Been married for 55 years.**

How did you meet? **They originally met through Dusty's brother, Mike, when Ted was 13 years old. Dusty was a few years younger. Both of their fathers were military so they moved around to different bases. While going to college in Westover, Ted worked as a part time lifeguard where he met up with Dusty again after about 4 years. Ted said, "She looked great in a bikini and had long blonde hair." At the time Dusty was a singer with the group, Up With People. They dated from August of 1967 and were married in February of 1968.**

Where are you from? **Ted was born in Long Beach, California and lived there for a brief 3 months. His Dad was Air Force and was stationed in New Hampshire, Florida, Nebraska, New York, and retired here in Colorado. Dusty was born in Sacramento, California. She also had a Dad in the Air Force and lived in California, Italy, New York and Hawaii. They would come to Colorado to visit and eventually moved here.**

Employment? **Ted's military career lasted for 29 years including being stationed all over the U.S. and world. He was in Army ROTC and joined the Army as a commissioned officer. He was deployed to Germany in the 3rd Infantry and the 101st Air Born Division in Vietnam. He was a platoon leader and rifle company command leader in Vietnam. After being wounded he taught ROTC in Charlotte. From there he went to armor school in Kentucky as a student in tactics, tank gunnery and maintenance. He then went to Berlin for four years. Back to Georgia he went. He was involved with the Bradley Fighting Vehicle Team building prototypes and training soldiers. He then went on to college in Kansas and then to Fort Hood, TX. He was back to Germany for two years as a battalion command leader. From there he went to the Army War College in Pennsylvania learning high level strategy. He came to Fort Carson and was a garrison commander. He was a brigade commander in Georgia. He then went to Italy and was the chief of staff/deputy commander for the Southern Europe Task Force. After retiring he then secured a civilian contract position as a deputy and director to field three heavy brigades to the Saudi Arabian oil fields for six years. After that he was with Alliance Science and Tech working on battlefield simulations at Fort Carson. He then went on to be the director of training for the Saudi Arabian National Guard for a year and a half. He said, "there were some very bad guys out there and I had a few close calls." From 2006-2014 he became the Western Regional Manager for the Bradley Fighting Vehicle. He trained crews on usage and maintenance. He is now fully retired. Dusty was very supportive of Ted's career. She raised**

the children and helped other wives with family problems. Ted says, "She is a terrific mother and grandmother."

Kids? **Ted and Dusty have five children, including a set of twins (their youngest were twins which was a surprise). Their first son and two daughters followed Dad's footsteps and joined the military. They have 13 Grandkids total. They are blessed to have three of their kids living close by.**

Favorite club activity? **Ted enjoys being in the 4th of July parade in Monument and usually takes a grandchild along with him. He also enjoys the autocrosses.**

Hobbies? **Ted has been a Pikes Peak Range Rider for 17 years and has held various offices. He leases a Pinto horse at the Air Force Academy. He is also an ambassador at Mt. Carmel Veterans Service Center. He is involved with his church. He also has a charter license to sail. Ted is currently co-chair of CSCC's highway beautification. Dusty sings in church. She also has a pottery studio in Monument called Clay and Colors. Both enjoy being with their children and grandchildren.**

What is the best vacation you ever took? **They took a Viking River Cruise down the Danube with Dusty's sister and husband. Ted really enjoyed the history with stops along the way including Czechoslovakia, Hungary, and Slovenia.**

What is your dream corvette? **Ted said that he would love to have a '65 Roadster, but he does love his 2012.**

How did your love of Corvettes come about? **Ted has loved Corvettes since he was 10 years old and would build car and airplane models.**
