
## Ron Fellows Driving School - Stage 1

Once again Todd and I headed to Pahrump, NV to attend the Ron Fellows Performance Driving School. We had both take the Corvette Owners Schools for the C7 (Todd for the ZR1 and I for the Grand Sport) and for the C8's. This time Todd took the next step – Stage 1. This class was similar to the Corvette Owners School, however it focused less on Corvette electronics and more on universal car control and cornering techniques. It included even more track time and an introduction to open lapping. With open-lapping, Todd learned how to safely and properly pass other drivers without being guided by an instructor. It also included instructor lead/follow track sessions and student lead/follow track sessions. Todd was on the same track as when he took the ZR1 owners' school. He obtained a faster top speed with the ZR1(135 mph) however he had a better time with the C8. He learned how to improve his technique, thus lowering his time with the great instruction from the trainers. As many of you know the program at the school is top notch and if you decide to take the additional step, we highly recommend it. Todd is looking into taking Stage 2 in the future. They currently had one Z06 on-site. It was torch red and a beauty. They plan on offering a Z06 class starting in April so they will have to increase their fleet.

#### **Colorado's Corvette Community Continues to Thrive**

From the absurdly quick speeds to the sleek and timeless designs, Corvettes have stayed prominent within car culture throughout the United States. While the classic feel has always been a big draw for the brand, fans of the American made sports cars have something new to look forward to. The new 2023 Z06 has a new naturally aspirated V8 engine, the most powerful naturally aspirated V8 engine in GM history.

Mike Neufeld, a semi-retired Corvette technician, is giving the new model high praise due to its supercar capabilities, and its reasonable price point. "The Z06 to me is a true supercar," said Neufeld. "It's a naturally aspirated engine... with a flat-plane crank shaft, which allows greater revs by far."

Neufeld has worked at Daniel's Long Chevrolet since 2007, located in Colorado Springs, Colorado. This dealership was the home to the Colorado Springs Corvette Club from 2012 to 2022. The Colorado Springs Corvette Club is the largest of the state's 12 Corvette clubs with 320 members, and just celebrated its 60th Anniversary. Some are excited about the announcement of the new, mid-engine, 2023 Z06 Corvette.

Car enthusiast Cesar Gonzalez felt that the excitement radiating from the new Z06 is just what is to be expected from Corvette. "Corvette definitely gets better and better throughout the years, so I would say this will get a lot of publicity," said Gonzalez. "I know folks might think it's just another car with a powerful engine, but if you took the time to look into it, you'd see the differences," said Gonzalez.

Neufeld noted that rising gas prices, and incentives to buy electric cars might compete with the engine innovation. Even recently a leak of a mockup model for a hybrid engine Corvette, caused an overall stir and mix of emotions. "There's definitely an interest in electric cars... that would be why Corvette is going to build their E-Ray," Neufeld said. The E-Ray will not be fully electric, but it will be unlike a car Corvette has ever produced before. "It's going to be a hybrid type gasoline engine that powers the rear wheels, and it'll have electric planetary drives on the front, so you're basically looking at an all-wheel drive Stingray, which is going to be pretty amazing in itself," Neufeld said. This model is vastly different from the typical rear-wheel drive, gas engine, sports cars Corvette is known for.

Car lovers are split between loving or hating electric vehicles, but some can find joy in both. Daniel Trejo, an automotive technician student at Front Range Community College, noted that he finds fascination in both sides of car production. "Every car is welcomed," said Trejo. "I find fascination in cars in general. Anything can be interesting... new technology is interesting," Trejo said.

Neufeld said he enjoys all the facets of car clubs. "It seems like every weekend in the summer there's a race, a rally, a car show," said Neufeld. "There's something there for everybody... people like the camaraderie and like to be a part of something where people are having fun."

Trejo agreed that the car community is diverse. "Everyone is nice, and welcoming, and helpful," said Trejo. "You really see everything. From cars to bikes, everything is out here (in Colorado)."





#### 2024 Chevy Corvette E-Ray Hybrid Debuts Jan. 17

The first hybrid Chevrolet Corvette is coming soon.

Chevy in an Instagram post on Tuesday confirmed the debut of the electrified 'Vette for Jan. 17 and posted a video showing off some of the car, which will be called the Corvette E-Ray.

The video shows the car will have a Stealth mode that will enable it to run on electric power alone. However, there are no details on what range or top speed will be possible in this mode.

Unmasked prototypes are currently testing in the wild, and photos of the car briefly showed up on Chevy's website last month. They confirm the Corvette E-Ray will feature the same wide-body design as the Corvette Z06 that arrived for 2023, though the Z06 features black accents for its aero parts whereas the E-Ray sticks with body color.


The E-Ray is expected to feature one or possibly two electric motors powering the front axle and the regular Corvette Stingray's 6.2-liter V-8 powering the rear axle. An electric motor integrated with the C8 Corvette's 8-speed dual-clutch automatic transmission, and capable of driving the rear wheels, is also a possibility, judging by a recent patent.

Peak output is expected to fall anywhere from 600-650 hp. A more powerful hybrid configuration is expected during the C8 Corvette's product cycle, and rumors say it will be a range-topping variant called the Zora.

Sales of the Corvette E-Ray are due start in the summer.

Chevy eventually plans to introduce a fully electric Corvette, though most likely not until the arrival of a redesigned C9 Corvette. General Motors has said it aims to have all of its light vehicles powered by electricity by 2035. What might surprise some is that the electric Corvette lineup may eventually be expanded with additional body styles, such as an SUV. However, nothing on that front has been confirmed yet.
