

I began the "slide show" via the September 2023 issue of the Vette Set and said I would continue the slide show in subsequent issues. I have included 4 photos and captions of the Carl Casper Custom Carisma Exhibit currently running through December 31, 2023.

Turbo Shark

Carl Caper has always had an affection and admiration for Corvette, has owned many over the years and built two Corvette inspired creations. Carl began his work on the Turbo Shark starting with a 1964 convertible, unveiling it to the world in 1966. Auxiliary power was added to the 327 ci. 300 HP engine with an experimental Turbonique monopropellant turbine running on Thermolene and oxygen fuels. At maximum output, the supplemental supercharged turbine rotor hit 92,000 rpm while raising the HP to 700.



Turbo Shark's Ruby-Red plexiglass was hand blown to form the bubble top. The brilliant diamond dust pearlescence under the body's base paint was highlighted with a customblend ruby red translucent acrylic lacquer.

Renegade Duece

The 1932 Ford sedan had been heavily used and abused. The sedan needed a lot of work and 47 years passed before Carl began to create the Renegade Duece. The body received extensive modifications. The 283 Corvette engine that had patiently sat for all those years fired right up to "hit the road" as soon as it was installed. It still had the Corvette Duntov camshaft.

Badboy

The classic roadster is considered to be one of the most popular hot rods ever and an iconic example of one of Casper's finest builds. Simplicity was the main theme as Carl designed the super-clean but fun driver with countless conservative personal touches. The Badboy was used as an experimental lab for exploring hydrogen and other hybrid fuels.

A 350 high-performance Corvette crate engine proved to be an excellent choice for street cruising.



The Badboy chassis features front and rear independent suspension with 11-inch disc brakes. Headlights and LED taillights were custom fabricated along with the low-profile windshield. Oak and steel braces were used for re-enforcement throughout the fiberglass body. A 3-piece hood and custom aluminum grill were added before applying the striking emerald green paint.
