NCM SCHEDULED EVENTS FOR 2024

EXHIBITS

March 15 - December 31, 2024: Luster-Realism and Hyperrealism in Contemporary Automobile and Motorcycle Painting. The traveling exhibit is comprised of 55+ paintings by 15 of today's artists.

June, 2024: *Ground to Sky – the February 12, 2014 Sinkhole Re-Imagined.* The Cave-In exhibit includes documents, moments, machines and memories of that day.

October 2024: An American Love Affair - Pop Culture and the Corvette. This exhibit will include new Corvettes, artifacts, and displays in the Skydome.

ON-SITE MUSEUM EVENTS

April 25 - 27, 2024: Annual Michelin Bash (First On-Site event for 2024)

May 1 - 31, 2024: *Military Appreciation Month.* The Mobil 1 sponsored event includes Vets 'n Vettes, which began on 2008 and was held on Veteran's Day until last year.

June 2024: The 92ND 24 Hours of LeMans. The endurance race is scheduled for June 15-16, 2024 at the Circuit de la Sarthe in LeMans, France. In the past, the NCM was one of three world-wide venues that carried the broadcast live with viewing in the NCM theatre. The dates of the viewing event have not been announced as yet. Registrants will have access to the Museum for the entire time period.

August 29 – 31, 2024: 30^{TH} Anniversary Birthday Celebration. The Celebration includes the 26^{TH} Hall of Fame Induction Ceremonies. The HOF inductees have not been announced. Chris Capshaw is leading the CSCC caravan and has the details for this exciting road trip.

C8 Corvette Production News

2024 Corvette E-Ray Production Has Started

Production of GM's first-ever hybrid, all-wheel-drive Vette, the 2024 Chevy Corvette <u>E-Ray</u>, is slowly getting under way, having begun Monday night, December 11th at the GM Bowling Green plant in Kentucky where all Corvettes sports are produced.

The start of 2024 Corvette E-Ray assembly, which a GM employee memo called a "historic moment in Corvette history" per a report by *The Detroit News*, was apparently filmed, though the video has not yet been made available to the public.

The hybrid drivetrain was introduced to give the E-Ray thrilling performance off the starting line rather than for environmental reasons according to an October discussion and first drive shared by Jay Leno and Corvette Executive Chief Engineer Tadge Juechter. The hybrid AWD setup develops 655 peak horsepower and delivers a zero to 60 mph time of 2.5 seconds, while also allowing the new Corvette variant to cover the quarter-mile in a mere 10.5 seconds.

To achieve these impressive results, the 2024 Corvette E-Ray is motivated by the naturally aspirated 6.2L V8 LT2 gasoline engine, located as usual behind the cockpit. The E-Ray shares the LT2 with the C8 Corvette Stingray, but pairs the ICE powerplant with a single front-mounted electric motor and 1.9 kWh battery pack. The V8 powers the rear wheels, while the electric motor motivates the front wheels.

GM pulled the sheets on the Chevy E-Ray early in 2023 on the 70th anniversary of the Corvette's original launch, with the start of regular production (SORP) originally scheduled for Monday, October 23rd 2023. This date was then pushed back to Monday, November 27th, though this planned start also failed to materialize.

In addition to its North American rollout, the 2024 Chevy C8 Corvette E-Ray will arrive in Australia in 2024. It will be the third of the Corvette variants to go on sale Down Under, with the C8 Stingray already available and the C8 Z06 soon to arrive in Oceania. The Australian E-Ray will be produced in a right-hand-drive (RHD) configuration and will be sold by General Motors Specialty Vehicles, or GMSV.



C4 Upper Ball Joint Replacement

Figure 1. Replacing the ball joints in a C4 isn't as hard as most people think, although it is a bit time consuming and a complete front-end alignment is required after the installation is complete. The hardest part of this project is the removal of the upper control arms, but once they're out of the car, the rest of the project is fairly straight forward, so that's where we'll pick it up here.





Figure 3. The ball joints are riveted to the control arms at the factory, so the first task is to drill out the heads of the rivets, then knock the rivets out using a punch and a ball peen hammer.

Figure 4. Here's the cleaned-up control arm after removing original ball joint. A 3M scuff pad or some steel wool can be used to clean up the aluminum control arm prior to installing the new ball joint.

Figure 5. Installing the new ball joints is simply a matter of bolting them in using the supplied hardware and securing them with the nylon lock-nuts. Supporting the control arm with a block of wood makes the job a bit easier.


Figure 6. Here's the refurbished control arm with new ball joints and bushings installed, all cleaned up and ready to re-install in your C4.

How to Replace C5 Headlight Actuator Module

- **1.** Check Fuses Here's the problem: your Corvette's headlights are stuck in the Up position and won't retract automatically. To get them back down, they must be lowered using the knobs on the backs of the headlight motors. Fuses are the first items to check before you go any further, and that means checking them on both the inside and under-hood fuse panels.
- **2.** Use Jack Stands & Inserts Always use jack stands to prop your car up while working on it. Use a <u>iack insert</u> in the frame rails of your C5 Corvette to avoid any rocker panel damage when jacking.
- **3. Check Headlamp Maxi-Circuit Breaker -** The finger is pointing to the 20 amp headlamp maxi-circuit breaker (#52) (Figure 1) on the instrument panel fuse block located on the passenger side under the toe board.
- **4. Remove Breaker -** Remove the maxi-circuit breaker (Figure 2) before changing the control module, as you don't want any current going through the circuit wire while you're working on it.
- **5. Raise & Unplug Right Headlamp** Open the hood and raise the right headlamp manually if it isn't already up. Then unplug the right headlamp wiring connector from the forward lamp wiring harness. (Figure 3) You should then see the actuator control module. It looks like this. (Figure 4)
- **6. Remove Closeout Panel** Go under the car and remove the front fascia lower closeout panel by removing the bolts that attach it to the wheelhouse panel. (Figuer 5)
- **7. Remove Valance Panel** Remove the bolts that hold it to the valance panel. The closeout panel can then be removed by pulling down on it.
- **8. Release Brake Caliper Cooling Duct** Once that's out of the way, release the brake caliper cooling duct from the front fascia and reposition the duct so you have access to the actuator control module above it. (Figure 6)
- **9. Unplug Connectors -** Unplug the two connectors from your Corvette's actuator control module. (Figure 7)
- 10. Replace Headlight Actuator Control Module Use a 10mm socket or nut driver to remove the two bolts that retain the module, and then replace it with the new one. Secure it with two bolts, plug the connectors back in, reposition the cooling duct, and replace the closeout panel making sure you secure all components with the fasteners removed previously. Next, plug in the headlamp wiring harness connector, replace the 20 amp maxi-circuit breaker, and check out your now properly functioning headlights. Job complete! (Figure 8)

C7 Launch Control from C7 Owners Manual and Zic Motorsports

Launch Control assists Corvette drivers in accelerating from a standing start, which can shave seconds off your time at track days or drag strip. The steps to enabling Launch Control are a little different for automatic and manual Corvette Z51s and non-Z51s.

Non-Z51 C7 Automatics

- 1. Select or switch to TRACK mode.
- 2. Press the button in the middle of the mode selector dial <u>twice</u> to show "Competitive Mode" on your driver's display.
- 3. Press the brake down <u>HARD</u> (like a panic stop).
- 4. Press the accelerator all the way to the floor smoothly and quickly. This will stabilize your RPMs between 2200-2500 RPMs. You can hold it there as long as you want, just make sure they are stabilized.
- 5. Release the brake quickly. The computer will compensate for everything and give as little wheel spin as possible.

Non-Z51 C7 Manuals

- Selector switch to TRACK mode.
- Press the button in the middle of the mode selector dial <u>twice</u> to put it in PTM
 Performance Traction Management (PTM) mode. You can select any of the
 sub-modes in PTM.
- 3. Press the clutch all the way in and put it in 1st gear.
- 4. Press the accelerator all the way to the floor smoothly and very fast to stabilize your RPMs around 4500 RPMs. Hold it there as long as you want, but make sure they are stabilized.
- 5. Release the clutch quickly but smoothly. You may get a little chirp of tires, but the computer will compensate for everything and give as little wheel spin as possible.

C7 Z51 Automatics

- 1. Select or switch to TRACK mode.
- 2. Press the button in the middle of the mode selector dial <u>twice</u> to put it in PTM mode. You can select any of the sub-modes in PTM.
- 3. Press the brake down HARD (like a panic stop).
- 4. Press the accelerator all the way to the floor smoothly and quickly. This will stabilize your RPMs between 2200-2500 RPMs. You can hold it there as long as you want, just make sure they are stabilized.



Many C8 Owners have had battery issues, to include dead batteries on brand new cars. Many times this happens with no apparent drain on the system. GM Service Techs have been quoted as saying there's over 50 computer systems running on a C8, even when shut off. Many of these computers "wake up" every 15 minutes or so to determine current vehicle status. Here's some info on C8 charging rates. During normal driving the voltage gauge shows around 12.5 volts. Many times, the gauge jumps to 13 volts for a second. sometimes it jumps to 14 volts for a few seconds. GM Service Tech said this is normal.

In fact, this is normal on modern GM vehicles. The voltage is regulated based on a combination of battery state and electrical demand. This method puts less load on your engine thereby saving gas. After review of the GM Corvette Service Manual description of the charging modes it says there are 5 different charging modes depending on various conditions. Each will have a different range of alternator output voltages. Those alternator output voltages are what you will be reading when the car is running. A graphic illustration of the voltage ranges for each mode is shown above, that you may find interesting. (Figure 1)

Keeping all this in mind, does the C8 charging system maintain the battery voltage at a fully charged state? You may notice when that it seems that even after driving or other times when one would expect to see about 12.5 volts, the actual voltage is less. When you plug in the Battery Maintainer (Figure 2) after running the car, it will indicate the battery is not fully charged, and take a while to show "fully charged."

The C8 charging system is very similar to the C7's; as it <u>does not</u> hold the battery at <u>maximum charge</u> but it holds it at <u>optimum charge</u> based on a variety of conditions. In conjunction with care and use of your Battery Maintainer, you will have no problem getting 4-5+ years out of a properly maintained factory AC Delco battery.

CSCC Corvette 101 – Part 3 ... Corvettes for Newbies Corvette-Related Acronyms and Terms (not all-inclusive)

Z51 – A sport package option above the basic Corvette model which readies the car for track use and harder driving. Stickier tires, bigger brakes, improved cooling and exhaust, enhanced traction, and depending on generation, a power increase are typical in the Z51 package.

206 – The Z06 option / model makes the Corvette legitimately track-ready. It includes grippier tires, stiffer suspension, further cooling for the engine and brakes, downforce-generating aero package, and stronger brakes all around. In addition, it includes significantly increased horsepower and in many generations, a wider body to accommodate these upgrades.

207 – A performance upgrade package specifically for C7 and C8 Corvette Z06 models. It includes a Carbon fiber aero package with larger front splitter, front-corner dive planes, a larger rear wing and underbody strakes, a unique FE7 suspension with specific Magnetic Ride Control 4.0 calibrations, Michelin Sport Cup 2R ZP tires developed specifically for the Z06, available carbon fiber wheels (on C8 versions) that deliver a 41-pound reduction in unsprung mass and Brembo carbon ceramic brake system featuring larger, 15.7-inch-diameter front rotors and 15.4-inch-diameter rear rotors.

ZR1 – Simply put, it's the ultimate Corvette model of each generation. ZR1 was first used on the C3 Corvette, where it indicated a strengthened transmission, more powerful brakes, upgraded cooling, and stiffer suspension. Similar enhancements remained hallmarks of later ZR1s. For the C4 generation, called the ZR-1 (hyphen), it included an exclusive 5.7-liter engine with dual-overhead camshafts, contrasting the standard engine's pushrod valvetrain. For the C6 ZR1 (no hyphen) a supercharger was added to its 6.2-liter engine for 638 hp, while carbon ceramic brakes and numerous carbon-fiber body components added lightness. Chevrolet revived the ZR1 badge for the final edition of the C7, and made it the hardest-core Corvette to date. Again, a supercharger was used, this time a larger unit which necessitated a bulging hood to fit. That, plus stronger engine internals resulted in a power output of 755 hp, making it the most powerful production Corvette ever. Extensive aerodynamics were part of this performance package, including an available carbon-fiber wing, which provided 950 pounds of downforce. As of this writing, a C8 ZR1 is currently in advanced development with testing underway at the Nürburgring track in Germany. This C8 ZR1 version is expected to be released by 2025.

Z Mode – Not to be confused with any of the above models, all C8 Corvettes have a feature called *Z Mode*. This mode is enabled by a button on the steering wheel to provide instant access to a customized calibration of the driver's preferred suspension settings, steering feel, exhaust note, dash display and transmission / powertrain settings. So why is it called "Z"? It's a specific tribute to the automotive vision of none other than Zora Arkus-Duntov, the legendary GM engineer and so-called "Father of the Corvette." He knew a mid-engine layout would elevate the Corvette to new heights, but sadly he never lived to see it come to fruition.






