



Healing the Sick in  
the Name of Jesus

November 3, 2006

Dear Hal Tumbelson and the Colorado Springs Corvette Club,

We at Mission Medical Clinic (MMC) would like to express our deepest appreciation and gratitude for your gift of \$130.00 for the ongoing work of our clinic. We have been open for two and a half years offering free medical care and free prescription medications to all of our patients. We have already given away over \$1,500,000 in free prescription medications and had 2200 patient visits.

MMC is now supported by over 50 churches who send volunteers, money, food for volunteers, and donations of needed support items. The staff of over 200 are all volunteers, working as missionaries in Colorado Springs. This clinic is a miracle of God's creation in our own city.

MMC has a Diabetic Clinic where all diabetic patients receive free blood sugar monitors and strips, as well as medication. Patients are given care for their feet and their eyes as well as education in how to eat by a Certified Diabetic Educator. In addition, MMC is the only place in town where people with no money and no insurance can get a free cast on a broken limb. We have now have a Christian dentists who will partner with us to open free dental care this fall. We do physical therapy at no charge for our patients who need it.

Unfortunately, our property has been put up for sale. Memorial Hospital has made it possible for us to purchase the building for \$940,000. We still need \$460,000 to meet that goal. This would insure a secure future and enable us to expand our dental and eye care for healing the sick in the Name of Jesus. It is through contributors like you that will enable us to buy our property and keep the clinic open to the needy of Colorado Springs.
