

June Meeting Minutes

The June meeting was called to order by Vicki Ury at 7:03 p.m. (Pres. Tom Hoepfner was on vacation) Vicki took a minute to recognize June 6th as the anniversary of D-Day, and to thank all of those, past and present, for their service.

Guests were introduced by Diane Stermer. Butch Herschell and Diane Holmes were voted in as new members.

Treasurer's Report – In Lorren Loewen's absence, Vicki reported \$5220.95 in available funds. Reported later in the meeting, but included here, the Fun in the Sun Car Show netted \$254.35. The Where's Waldo Rallye netted \$321. The joint venture La Junta autocross with SCCC (Pueblo) netted CSCC \$610.

May meeting minutes – With only 2 minor corrections – The Heritage Car Show June 16 is being put on by the Down the Road Corvette Club, and a heading correction on the NCM article, the May meeting minutes were approved.

Car News or Upgrades – Rick Mendoza reported damage to hood requiring repaint, and T.J Larson reported new windshield, all due to road-rock damage on the way back from car show in Denver.

Mike Bochnak reported he replaced the clutch in his 1993 Z-R1, adding something about it no longer slips at 140mph. That fact proven by a short burst of speed required when a C6 and a Ferrari seemed to egg him on to race, Mike, of course, nailed it leaving them in his dust. (Editor's note: Isn't it fun to drive a Corvette!)

Club Merchandise – In the absence of Lorren, Vicki reported merchandise will no longer be available on-line. It has not really been used in some time, so will revisit the need sometime in the future. However, even though merchandise was not available prior to this meeting, merchandise will continue to be available at the monthly meetings, or call Lorren Loewen to arrange for order or pickup.

Laser Printer – John C. Gue has graciously responded to the request for a laser printer by donating one to

the Club for supplemental use at events. Thank you John.

Club Charity – SAY Yes! Update-

The Board is seeking clarification and documented status of the program doing business as SAY Yes! in Colorado, through Campus Crusade for Christ. There is more than one option available to satisfy documented proof.

Information and letters have been sent to the program director Stacy Butler, requesting she pursue a clarification and resolution to status in Colorado.

The registration option through the Colorado Secretary of State for 501c3's doing business in Colorado, and webpage verification, helps protect residents and businesses by providing a list of charities legitimately soliciting funds in Colorado.

Rick Mendoza, as sponsor indicated he would assist Stacy in resolving the issue. [Since the meeting, SAY Yes! responded by submitting one of the options available, documenting their legal status.]

Prior to next year's selection of a Club Charity, the Board will be reviewing requirements in the Standing Rules as they relate to Colorado Statutes and verification.

Governor – Rik Noring announced several upcoming events. Check webpage calendar for most up-to-day information. The La Junta event in May went so well, they are planning another 2-day event September 28 and 29. This time, it will be a joint venture with Pueblo, DCA, and CSCC.

It has been fun for sure, he has trained many in the finer intricacies of concours showmanship and competition. He has done a superb job. Our sincere thanks to Nick as he steps down from the head judge position – something about retirement and change of pace.

Barrett Benson has volunteered to take over the reins. He comes with proven personal knowledge of concours quality. His 2002 was

selected for the National Corvette Museum 60th Anniversary exhibit of Vettes for each production year.

Monument Parade/BBQ – Pete Olejnik announced the Monument parade is on this year. A sign-up sheet was passed around. Pete will contact everyone when he has specifics. Those interested in participating, but not signed up, contact Pete.

Many CSCC members fared well at the bright and beautiful **Memorial Day DCA Autocross** held at the Tenderfoot Parking Lot in Keystone, Colorado. It's not the largest lot but the course layout never ceases to amaze the racers. Leaving the starting gate and accelerating towards a large group of Ponderosa Pines got the adrenaline flowing, and then a right-hand turn took the racer to a group of large boulders outlining the parking lot.
