Entry Fees: Participation Coupons can **only** be used to offset cost of entry fee for CSCC-hosted sanctioned events.

<u>Transfer of Participation Coupon:</u> Coupons cannot be transferred or pooled. Member name(s) will be listed and addressed on coupon postcard.

Expiration: CSCC Participation Coupons expire October 31<sup>st</sup> in the distribution year.

<u>Restrictions:</u> No refunds will be given for partially used coupons, and lost coupons will not be replaced.

Coupon recommendation is to be in place for 1 year, with coupon value to be reviewed annually.



## **Road Safety**

Museum Update: Assembly Plant Paint Shop As part of GM's remodeling/expansion project at Bowling Green, December 14<sup>th</sup> marked the beginning of construction on the new paint shop. Half the size of the current assembly plant, it will add a half-million sq ft to operations, with its first Corvette scheduled to be painted in April 2017. GM said the expansion was needed because the paint technology used for the Corvette is special due to carbon-fiber and specialized plastics, all off-the-body components. The new shop, while improving quality, will have additional spray capabilities, spray booths and automation enabling some new colors that can't be done today. Offering customers more choices, the ten colors now available will increase to twelve, and a 'tri-coat' technique promises a more fluorescent depth to the finish.

#### MARK YOUR CALENDAR - 4 BIG EVENTS IN 2016

Now that CSCC's making plans for the new year, I want to remind you of some upcoming events at the National Corvette Museum for 2016.

**BASH** The NCM officially kicks off its event season with the Bash, now known as the "Michelin NCM Bash", slated this year for April 28-30. If the tradition continues, Chevrolet will roll out the 2017 Corvette Stingray.

**C4 GATHERING** May 12-14 the Museum will be host to all those interested in the 4<sup>th</sup> Generation Corvette, bringing participants various activities, seminars, and info specific to the C4. A day at the new Motorsports Park is on the agenda.

**22<sup>nd</sup> ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATION** Marking 22 years of growth and change, the 22<sup>nd</sup> anniversary event will be September 1-3, packed with activities, and honoring these three Hall of Fame inductees:

Bob Bondurant helped validate Corvette as a world-class sports car during the early years, winning on racetracks in both the US and abroad. In 1959, he won 18 of 20 Sports Car Club of America (SCCA) B/Production races, and from 1960-63 he won 30 of the 32 races he entered. Of particular note, as one of the best at the toe/heel maneuver, he did the shifting and clutch sequences shown in the movie "Grand Prix". Today, Bob owns and operates his High Performance driving school, featuring Corvettes, in Phoenix AZ.

Ralph Kramer was one of the first Chevy executives to bolster GM support for the Corvette Museum in its founding years, helping establish connections and preserving history. Had it not been for him, the 1 millionth Corvette wouldn't be a Museum display piece today! During his tenure at Chevrolet public relations from 1973-1995, he managed the brand pace car and race engine presence at the Indianapolis Speedway.

For <u>Donna Mae Mims</u> a.k.a. "The Lady in Pink," it was love at first sight when it came to Corvette. After purchasing a brand new one from Don Yenko Chevrolet, she soon joined the Yenko/Chevrolet race team that dominated A/Production and B/Production SCCA racing with Corvette. Mims served as Manager of Hi-Performance at Yenko Sports Cars, was a freelance writer for several car magazines, and founded the Pittsburg-area Three Rivers Corvette Club. On a personal note, I watched her race her pink Austin Healy sprite at Wentzville, Mo. in the 1964 inaugural race at Mid America Road Race track. As a member of the St. Louis Corvette Club, I took several laps around the track; my '56 Vette would have lapped her sprite --- but alas, she wasn't on the track!
