The November meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by President Chris Capshaw. As the new president, Chris shared his personal agenda and concept as to how the officers, board, and members interact.

Corvette "Court" - Merchandise – "Mr. Merchandise" Bruce Unger, modeled the new winter line of hats, breathable, and in black and golden rod (yellow). With samples available at each meeting, members can check out the merchandise before each meeting.

CSCC Charity Nomination

Presentations - There are two 501c3 charities in the running for the 2019 designated charity - Crossfire Ministries and Urban Peak of Colorado Springs. There will be a ballot vote at the December meeting to select the charity to receive 1/3 of the renewal membership dues, and the gross proceeds from a selected event during the year.

Debbie Butterfield, representing her nomination of Crossfire Ministries, explained how the charity serves the working poor to help them make ends meet. They are allowed to shop once a week for basic needs like, paper towels, toilet paper, razors, toothbrush, toothpaste, deodorant, canned and boxed food. Staffed by volunteers, they serve over 600 households each week.

Jerry Ludke introduced Andy Peterson, representing Jerry's nomination for **Urban Peak**. Andv reported Urban Peak is the only organization that works with homeless youth in Colorado Springs. They run a street outreach program, shelter program, and a housing program. Each youth has a case manager that, through the Urban Peak programs, tries to ignite the potential in each of the youth. He shared an example of a young lady from difficult circumstances, having recently successfully moved into their own apartment.

Both organizations are registered in the state of Colorado and in good

standing. The nomination letters can be viewed on the CSCC website, under Members Only.

Treasurer's Report – Anita Smith reported on the state of the budget and current reserves. She explained the board recommended budget for 2019, and after some discussion, the membership voted unanimously to approve the budget for 2019.

October Meeting Minutes – The October minutes were approved as printed in the November newsletter.

CSCC Christmas Food Baskets -

Brent Renholm announced \$6100 has been collected so far, with a goal of \$6500. There is still work to be done. Callers are needed, as well as drivers on December 8 to assemble and deliver the baskets. The more drivers we have, the fewer baskets each driver will have to deliver.

Dear Members of CSCC,

I would like the Colorado Springs Corvette Club to sponsor Crossfire Ministries for 2019. This charity is located in El Paso County, and is a 501c3, according to the Secretary of State's website. Crossfire helps needy families by providing food, toiletries, clothes, and household goods, as well as educational programs, kids' backpacks, holiday items, Bibles, and prayer. There are three main reasons I chose Crossfire.

First, Crossfire serves a large number of people in an efficient manner. During the three weekdays they're open, 200 to 250 families come each day. That's 600+ households helped each week. Recipients provide a valid id and proof of address for family members, and are then able to "shop" throughout the store. They can come back one day each week, no questions asked.

Second, Crossfire aids a group of people who often go unnoticed: the working poor. An estimated 72,000 of these people are struggling to stay afloat, pay their rent, etc. in Colorado Springs. When they're in a pinch, they can come to Crossfire to make ends meet.

Third, I was impressed by the friendly staff, including the executive director Renee Beebe, and the positive environment I encountered when I toured Crossfire on October 9. The volunteer workers seemed happy, and the place was abuzz with activity. Renee expressed her concern for the people of Colorado Springs, and her dream of a bigger, more streamlined facility.

Synthetic Oils

I had a reader write in (yes, I have a reader) and suggest I write something on Synthetic oils and why we should use them as opposed to other types of motor oil. First, a little education on oil.

Top of the line oils are "fully synthetic", which means it is still probably petroleum based and contains a minimum amount of synthetics to qualify as "fully". It's not 100%. Next, is blended or semi-synthetic and it contains more mineral oil, introduced as a mid-point between fully synthetic and regular oils, it's benefits are half as well, but lower cost. There is a ton of variations on these.

I remember when AMSOIL first came out as a synthetic oil, touting 25,000 miles between oil changes. It was the hot setup, but soon, your engine was trash. Of course in the 60's and 70's if you reached 100,000 miles, your car and engine were probably on the way out. Manufacturing tolerances in production had not reached the capability we have today. Bearing journals were good if they were controlled within +/-.001". Today, modern machinery is capable of holding tolerances of +/-.0002" or even better on a consistent basis. I also remember that switching to synthetics could cause your engine seals to spring leaks, as the gaskets were not made for it.

Today, engines are smaller and lighter, and produce more horsepower and torque per cubic inch than ever before. It stands to reason you need the best lubricant out there, which is why I recommend continuing to use synthetics in your full range of cars, especially your Corvette.

I can list about 11 benefits synthetic oils tout, but here are the most important ones:

- Longer engine life (less friction at cold starts, which is where a lot of engine wear happens.) Impossible to prove, but makes sense.
- Less friction equates to performance improvements.
 Actual field tests prove from 1.8% to 5% improvement in fuel mileage.
- When hot, less coking on turbo charger bearings.
 There's less sludge buildup in the engine as well.

What AMSOIL failed to recognize when they made their wild claims, was that combustion by-products accumulate at the same rate in the oil as before, and the only way to eliminate them is by changing the oil. For your new C7 Corvette, follow the messages on the console and it will tell you when it's time to change the oil. For older cars, I recommend 6000 miles between changes, using full synthetic.
