### NCM'S 4TH Artifact of the Month

In the March 2022 issue of *The Vette Set*, I reported on the Museum's new program highlighting a significant moment in Corvette history, *Artifact of the Month*. The 1983 Analog Dash Cluster was chosen as the 1<sup>st</sup> artifact, followed by artifact #2, the Croton Watch, and #3, the Betty Skelton 1956 Daytona Trophy. The 4<sup>th</sup> artifact is a specially designed ring celebrating the very first win at the 24 Hours of Le Mans race for the Pratt & Miller Corvette Racing era that produced 8 Le Mans victories, 15 additional racing championships for Corvette Racing, and 8 Corvette Hall of Fame (HOF) inductees!

Gary Pratt and Jim Miller formed Pratt & Miller Engineering in 1989. In 1996, the Corvette Racing era began with the blessing of John Middlebrook, General Manager of Chevrolet, and Herb Fishel (HOF 2015), Director of GM Motorsports. Program Manager Doug Fehan (HOF 2020) connected with Gary Pratt and Jim Miller (both HOF 2022), who would build their race cars based on the all-new C5 Corvette. With test driver Ron Fellows (HOF 2011) they would continue to develop the C5-R until 1999 when they began racing in the new American Le Mans Series. Gary Claudio (HOF 2012), Corvette Marketing Manager, was ready to make sure everyone in the world would take notice.

In 2001, with only two seasons behind them, the two-car Corvette Racing team took the overall win at the 24 Hours of Daytona in the #2 Corvette driven by Ron Fellows, Johnny O'Connell (HOF 2013), and Chris Kneifel. The #3 Corvette came in second-in-class, driven by Dale Earnhardt, Dale Jr., Andy Pilgrim (HOF 2012) and Kelly Collins. Following the victories, the team then raced at the 24 Hours of Le Mans, and after 24 hours they stood victorious on the podium with first and second place trophies!

Gary Claudio recalls that moment vividly, "standing on the podium looking down at this crowd, this ocean of people, as our National Anthem was played. They were all celebrating with us. They had adopted us. We had come hat in hand, humble, honoring the tradition of Le Mans, and they had accepted us. They loved the sound of that ground-pounding-American thunder and would flock to the fence when our cars would go down the Mulsanne Straight. Watching them now chant "Viva La Corvette" was a profound moment for all of us. We set out to compete internationally and represent GM, the Corvette, and the loyal patrons who loved and drove these cars, and we had won. We made history that day and would go on to do it seven more times." Claudio said the ring he donated to the Museum commemorating the 1st Le Mans win "…represents the hard work of the team, the sweat, the blood, the dedication, the passion, and the love that is best summed up in one word… Corvette."

28th Anniversary Celebration, the Museum's next major event, will be September 1<sup>st</sup>— 3<sup>rd</sup>. Many seminars and tours as well as track experiences are available. Online registration is open through August 15<sup>th</sup>.
